MASTER OF EDUCATION M.A.EDUCATION ORDINANCE

O. Ed. 6

Any person who has taken the degree of Bachelor of Education with minimum, 50 percent makes in aggregate in theory papers of this University or a Degree of another University with minimum 50% marks in aggregate in theory papers recognized as equivalent there-to may be admitted to the examination for the Degree of Master of Education after having fulfilled requirements as mentioned in R.Ed. 15.

R.Fd. 15:

- a) The Examination for the Degree of M.A.(Education) shall be by papers.
- b) A candidate desiring to appear for the M.A.(Education) Examination by papers must:

Attend a College of any other Institution recognized for the purpose and shall 'keep two terms to the satisfaction of the Head of the college/department.

The General Objectives of M.A.(Education) Course are:

- 1. To prepare professional personnel required for staffing of the Colleges of Education, B.Ed. & D.Ed. and DIET's
- 2. To prepare administrators and supervisors in schools and for positions of responsibilities in the Education Department at Institutions engaged in Education Research and Educational planning.
- 3. To prepare personnel for various educational services.

As per the practice two more chances following the last regular examination of the pre-revised course will be given to repeater students.

O. Ed. 3 Standard of passing

1) To pass the M. A. (Education) examination, a candidate must obtain at least 40% marks in each theory paper and 50% in the aggregate of all the theory papers (Head I) And 40% in dissertation and Viva-voce examination separately. And 50% aggregate of dissertation and viva-voce (Head II) taken together. To pass in the Field based Experiences 'related to Supervision and Evaluation of Practice teaching and other aspects of School

experiences of B.Ed. programme (Head III) he/she must. Obtain 50% marks. To pass in the Practicals (Head IV); he/she must obtain at least 40% marks in each practical separately and 50% in the aggregate of all the Practicals taken together. Such a candidate shall be declared to have passed the examination in second class.

- 2) Those obtaining at least 55% marks separately in Head I, Head III and Head IV shall be declared to have passed the examination in Higher Second Class.
- 3) Those obtaining at least 60% marks separately in Head I, Head III and Head IV shall 65% and above marks in the aggregate shall be placed in the First Class.
- 4) Those obtaining 70% and above marks separately in Head I, Head II, Head III and Head IV, and 75% and above marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have passed in First Class with Distinction.

NOTE

- A candidate failing in any of the four heads i.e. Head I, Head III
 and Head IV shall be required to appear for the examination under that
 Head only.
- 2. A candidate passing under individual Head but failing in aggregate marks required for passing shall have to appear for the paper is concerned Head in which he has secured less than 50% of marks.
- 3. A candidate who has once passed in any of the theory Paper/Head of passing with 50% and above marks need not appear again for that theory Paper/Head.
